SUB: Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for induction of Khelo India Athletes

- 1. Introduction The Khelo India Scheme is a groundbreaking initiative launched by the Government of India to foster a culture of sports in the country. Introduced in 2018 with the vision of promoting sports at the grassroots level and identifying and nurturing young sporting talents to represent India on the international stage. This comprehensive scheme has brought about a paradigm shift in the Indian sporting ecosystem, focusing on holistic development, infrastructure enhancement, and the overall well-being of young athletes. The Khelo India scheme continues to be a feeder to the Target Olympic Podium Scheme of the Sports Authority of India.
- 2. Purpose The Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) outlined below is established for the induction of Khelo India Athletes. The purpose of this SOP is to outline the induction protocol and benchmarks for new athletes in the Khelo India Scheme in various disciplines under Khelo India Talent Identification and Development department (KITD). It aims to provide a transparent pathway for selection of athletes into the Khelo India Scheme as Khelo India Athletes and their further progression into the TOPs Scheme. An approved protocol for each sport discipline through a dedicated Talent Identification Committee (TIDC) ensures an efficient, fair, and conducive procedure for selection of athletes and their growth in sports.
- Scope This SOP applies to the complete selection process for Khelo India Athletes into the Khelo India Scheme for 21 identified sports disciplines. It encompasses the entire selection process, from shortlisting the athlete to their induction into the Khelo India Scheme.

4. Definitions/Abbreviations -

- Khelo India Scheme A scheme introduced in 2018 with the vision of promoting sports
 at the grassroots level and identifying and nurturing young sporting talents to represent
 India on the international stage.
- KIA: Khelo India Athlete, a talented athlete identified under the Khelo India Scheme.
- Age Verification Test (AVT): A mandatory test for all male athletes below the age of 17
 years and all female athletes below the age of 15 years as per the AVT Circular (Annexure
 A).
- HPD: High Performance Director

5. Process Flow

5.1 Approved Protocols for each Sports Discipline

- Sport specific Protocols are prepared and updated on regular intervals by the TIDC Members and HPD/HPM wherein sports specific benchmarks are set and tournaments/competitions recognized for shortlisting an athlete.
- 2. A TIDC member(s) or the HPD/HPM is deputed to the recognized tournaments/competitions for identifying potential athletes.
- The deputed member marks and gives points/scouts participants of the competition as
 per the scouting template/score/exceptional performance or talent of the athlete and
 shares a list of shortlisted athletes which, after discussion and concurrence from
 HPD/HPM is forwarded to KITD.
- The deputed member ensures that the shortlisted athlete submits a filled Player Basic Information Form (Annexure B) along with relevant documents like ID card, Birth Certificate, Passbook Copy/Cancelled cheque etc.

5.2 Shortlisting of Athlete by deputed TIDC Member

- 1. The Lead Research of the concerned sports discipline at KITD reviews the list, ensures that the grade/score of the shortlisted meets approved benchmark and identifies athletes eligible for an Age Verification Test (AVT).
- The LR ensures that the AVT of the athletes is done during his/her presence in the competition and in the hospital with which a tie up has been previously ensured as per the AVT Circular.

5.3 Communication of Approval

- Approvals are sought for induction of the shortlisted athlete, subject to successful AVT report, if applicable and vacancy in the sanctioned strength of KIAs for each sport discipline.
- 2. After getting approval from the competent authority athletes, who do not need an AVT (boys above 17 years and girls above 15 years), are notified as Khelo India Athletes. An office order/notification is sent to the athlete along with a Welcome Letter, Consent Form (Annexure B), Terms and Conditions of becoming a KIA, List of Academies and NCOEs wherein the athlete can seek admission.
- 3. The Athlete is also informed to fill and send the documents in response to the mail and to complete the admission process into an NCOE or Accredited Academy, if requested. The Office Order/Notification contains the Khelo India Unique ID (KIUD) with athlete's name and admission date from which he/she is eligible to receive Khelo India Scheme benefits.

5.4 Age Verification Test Report

- AVT reports are shared by the hospital/NCOE with KITD after which in case of a consistent AVT Report, the athletes are notified as Khelo India Athletes.
- In case of an inconsistent AVT Report, the athlete is informed and the report is sent to NCSSR for further action.

5.5 Access and Utilization

- Athletes access the approved services and facilities as per their entitlement to the amount of Rs. 6,28,400/- per year.
- The Khelo India Athlete may avail the facilities and receive benefits till the time he/she is in Khelo India Scheme.

5.6 Khelo India Athlete Assessment Camp

 All Khelo India Athletes have to attend two Khelo India Assessment Camps each year wherein the performance and sports specific tests are conducted.

5.7 Termination of Access

- The termination of KIAs from the Khelo India Scheme may be done on the basis of performance through periodic performance evaluation or performance/ done by the TIDC members/HPM in TIDC meetings conducted by the Khelo India Talent Development division.
- Doping: Any Khelo India Athletes caught Doping by NADA is immediately weeded out from the Scheme.
- A provision for self-withdrawal is also there, if any KIA does not want to continue
 with the scheme he/she may send an email and inform the KITD division regarding
 their self-withdrawal.
- 4. The comments of TIDC and the performance of the athlete is sent for approvals from the Competent Authority.
- 5. Once approved, athletes are formally informed in writing regarding their weeding out from the Khelo India Scheme.

6. Fund Disbursement

- As per the norms of the Khelo India Scheme, the total expenditure of Rs. 6,28,400
 per annum is provided to Khelo India Athletes practicing in an NCOE or an KIaccredited academy (Annexure C):
 - a. Rs. 1,58,000- for Diet Charges
 - b. Rs. 1,50,000- for Coaching/Sports Science/Management/Minor Injuries

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- c. Rs. 1,20,000- in Out of Pocket Allowance (OPA) Given quarterly.
- d. Rs. 60,000 Domestic Travel/Competitions & Related Expenses
- e. Rs. 50,000 for equipment game specific kitting
- f. Rs. 36,000-50,000 In Lodging Charges
- g. Rs. 30,000 Educational Tie-up
- h. Rs. 20,000 Sports Kitting
- Rs. 5,653 Insurance & Medical Expense
- For Non-Residential KIAs the funding will be the same as residential KIAs except the lodging, boarding & conveyance charges.
- 3. KIAs who have not joined in any of the accredited academies, are provided only Out of Pocket Allowance (OPA) of Rs. 1,20,000 per annum on a quarterly basis. Also, they are advised regularly by the KITD team to join any of their nearest NCOE or KI-accredited academies.

4. The attendance of KIAs is marked through the National Sport Repository System (NSRS).

Circular

To streamline the process of Age Verification Test (AVT), scientifically in line with the leading practices and to complete the process expeditiously, the AVT guidelines have been approved by the 13th High Power Committee (HPC) held on 08.06.2022 (Minutes Annexed). This AVT guidelines shall supersede all previous guidelines.

2. The approved guidelines for Age Verification Test (AVT) are as follows:

I. Age and methodology

Sr. No.	Gender	Age up to which AVT is to be conducted	and the property of the second

2	Female	Up to 15 years	 Dental Examination by Dentist.
			 Radiological Examination (TW3 method) by Radiologist.

Based on all three examinations the Age certificate shall be issued (Format enclosed) certified by all three experts. This shall be matched with the claimed chronological age of the athlete.

II. Documents

- A. For proof of DOB: Birth Certificate, Matriculation Certificate mentioning the DOB, Passports, Aadhar card, voter Id etc., preferably all documents where DOB is mentioned.
- B. Consent Form to undergo AVT.
- C. Players basic information Form.
- III. Important Guidelines to be followed for smooth functioning
- The Medical Officer/doctor at Regional Centre shall verify these documents and tie up with the local hospital for Radiological & Dental Examination & accompany the athletes to the hospital for AVT.

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 The process for AVT shall be completed at RC/NCOE level and they will be the custodian of all data related to AVT. The final report to be shared with KITD & National Centre for Sports Science & Research (NCSSR). In case, athlete is not satisfied she/he can appeal to Medical Appellate Board at AllMS New Delhi, which is already constituted by the High-Power Committee. All appellate cases will be dealt by National Centre for Sports Science & Research (NCSSR) at SAI, HQ.

SUBJECT: NORMS FOR EXPENDITURE UNDER KHELO INDIA TALENT DEVELOPMENT & FUNDING TO NATIONAL/REGIONAL/STATE ACADEMIES

In partial modification of the Office Order 3(5)/Sectt./KITD/HPC/2018-19 dated 02.08.2018. The approval of Competent Authority is hereby conveyed for modifications in expenditure norms of Khelo India Talent Development which will be effective from 02.08.2018.

1. AN OVERVIEW OF KHELO INDIA

- a) The Khelo India Scheme aims to encourage sports all over the country. It aims at strengthening the sports ecosystem in India by promoting the twin objectives of mass participation and promotion of excellence in sports. Further, the major aim of the program is to help Indian sportspersons to reach the pinnacle of world sports focusing at the Initial stage a podium finish at the 2024 and 2028 Olympics.
- b) The scheme has 12 verticals including Talent Search & Development & funding to the National/Regional/State academies. The operational guideline of these two verticals is contained in notification No F No 54-1/MYAS/MDSD/2017 Dated 26th December. Khelo India Talent Search & Development (KITD) envisages identification of 1,000 athletes (to be called Khelo India Athlete -KIA) every year through measures such as the holding of Khelo India competitions, NSF/SGFI competitions, etc. and by other methodologies for identification of talent. The Government has already formed committees such as TIDC (Talent Identification Development Committee) and TSC (Talent Screening Committee) consisting of eminent sportspersons who are recipient of honors such as Padma Shree awardees, Arjuna Awardees, Dronacharya awardees, senior coaches and representatives of National sports Federations. A High Powered Committee (HPC) has also been constituted to take all policy decisions. Once the athlete is identified as KIA, the funding of Rs 5 lac per athlete per year is available under the vertical "Khelo India Search & Development" vertical. The grant for training, equipment, sports science support will continue till such time as the athlete manifests progress and potential up to maximum of eight years. There will be weeding out every year based on performance bench mark.









- c) The identified sports talent will be given the option to Join SAI Sports academies, State Sports Academies or Sports academies established by private sector (including sports persons). Grants-in-aid can be provided under the vertical "Funding to National/Regional/State Academies" for establishment, operation and maintenance of sports academies in respect of identified disciplines to these academies.
- d) On the basis of recommendation of TIDC, HPC would grant accreditation to the academies provisionally for a period of one year initially. Subsequently, long term agreement would be entered into with accredited academies. The accreditation will be an ongoing process & more and more academies will be accredited to allow KIA to train at nearest location. The gap analysis of the academies would be done & the academies not meeting the bench mark can be de-accreditated.
- The Norms for the funding of residential Khelo India Athlete (KIA) under accredited sports academies.

Once a KIA takes admission into any of the academy, following expenditure would be incurred in respect of each KIA.

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*** Other terms and conditions mentioned in the Office order. 3(5)/Sectt./KITD/HPC/2018-19 dated 02.08.2018 except modifications made in the items no. 1 to 9 above shall remain unchanged.

- For non residential trainee in accredited academies, the funding will be same except for diet/conveyance grant to player. There will be no lodging charges.
- For each sports, the game specific equipment (consumable requirement will be decided subsequently.
- 3) If there is balance available out of player's budget, funds for equipment/consumables, sports science support, tournament exposure or exceptional case of injury etc, the same can be released after approval of the DG SAI & Chairman in view of exigency.
- 4) The budget available per player is Rs. 5,00,000 per year. The additional budget will be met out from funding to accredited academies. Apart from the above, following expenses may also be incurred from the head "funding to the national/state academies".
- 5) The amount mentioned in column 4 is the upper limit and the grant/reimbursement will be restricted to actual expenditure & on furnishing utilization certificate/bills except in the case of stipend to be paid to an athlete.
- 6) As mentioned above, for domestic travel etc for each of the tour, expenditure norms (attached) for junior camps will apply. Relevant norms are as under:-
 - a) For travel from place of academy to competition & back: By Air (restricted to economy class) provided the journey is more than 1200 Kms/18 hours. Else, restricted to AC III Train fare.
 - For coaching camps/competitions organized in the North Eastern Region, economy class air fare may be given to all athletes between Kolkata and the place of coaching camps/competitions. The same facility will be given to those from the North east from their place of academy to Kolkata and back for coaching camps, competitions, etc organized outside the North East. In such cases, Journey beyond Kolkata will be as per above norms.
 - b) Diet Charge: Up to Rs 480 per athlete per day (subject to actual days KIA is staying in the academy)
 - c) Boarding & lodging etc for camps/competition: The following rates shall be applicable:

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Transportation & maintenance charges will be admissible as follows :-

- Local transportation from place of stay to camp/competition venue on need basis as per actual by public transport or shared taxis;
- (ii) Fuel & maintenance charges for boats, motorcycles, escort vehicles etc used by the coaches for training purposes on need basis as per actual.

Note - The funds if available in player's budget will first be exhausted.

Funding to the Khelo India Athlete (KIA) trained in non accredited academies:

The Khelo India Athlete (KIA) who chooses to be trained in non accredited academies will be given Out of pocket allowances of Rs 1,20,000 per annum (to be paid quarterly in advance after joining the KI program) on the same basis as above to meet out of pocket expenses, minor injury management, travelling of parents for competition & other incidental expenses. They will also be given benefit of insurance claim.









5. Norms For other expenses:

- a) Junior national camp norms will apply for assessment camps, selection camps etc hiring of coaches/support staff & other incidental expenses.
- b) However, the lodging charges of Rs 300/- per player per day will be paid to accredited academies although sanctioned norms for Junior campers are Rs 1,200 per day. In exceptional cases, Director General SAI & Chairman, HPC will be empowered to sanction upto Rs 1,200/- per player per day (as per junior national camper norms) in case the accommodation is to be arranged in hotel etc.
- c) Miscellaneous expenses for camps, selection trial, visit of TSC/TIDC members other incidental expenses will be sanctioned at the level of DG, SAI.
- d) Junior National camps norms will apply for all selection trials leading to selection of players into the scheme once it is shortlisted by TSC.

6. Miscellaneous:

- a) The Out of pocket allowances will be given to Khelo India Athlete from the date he/she is part of the Khelo India Talent Development program. The "year" will have same meaning as financial year.
- b) All the benefit to the KIA already part of the scheme as per notification/accredited academies as per notification issued on or before 31³¹ July, 2018 would start from 1³¹ August, 2018. The benefit to KIA/academies notified subsequently would be from the month in which such notification is issued.
- c) The payment for coaching/sports science etc (item 1 of the table), lodging (item 3 of the table) will be made on pro rata (from the month in which admission is taken up to 31st March).
- d) Diet charges (item 2) as per actual subject to maximum of Rs 480 per day from the date of introduction of diet prescribed for junior national camper (copy enclosed). The academy needs to inform Khelo India Secretariat the date from which such diet will be introduced for the KIA.
- e) The budget for Kitting, consumables, domestic travel, & Education (item of expenditure mentioned at 4,5,6 & 9 in the table above) will be available for whole year for each of KIA provided the KIA is trained in an accredited academy for more than six month during the financial year (He /She Joins accredited academies on or before 30th September. (SAI in its academies has not done budgeting on prorata basis. Most of the competitions start from September & hence full year budget is required in such cases). However, for KIA Joining accredited academies after 30th September, 2018, these expenses will be on prorata basis

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f) For the Khelo India Athlete (KIA) already being trained in the accredited academy will get benefit from 1st August or date of notification as Khelo India Athlete or date of acceptance of the accredited academy whichever is later.
