DPAC vide its 43rd meeting dated 29.12.2023, an additional 250 KICs was permitted for operationalization in addition to 1000 KICs. Further, DPAC vide its 44th meeting dated 30.01.2024 approved a total of 112 new KICs, with bifurcation as under:

- i. 56 KICs in Districts which have no KIC right now.
- ii. 41 KICs to ensure 02 KICs per district in the North-East/Hilly region.

DPAC vide its 41st meeting dated 06.10.2023 (Agenda and Minutes at **Annexure-III-A**) and also in the 118th Finance Committee Meeting dated 22.11.2023 (Minutes at **Annexure-III-B**) has approved Capacity Building Program for the Past Champion Athletes (PCAs) hired in Khelo India Centres (KICs) for an amount of INR 3,24,53,800/- for 1295 PCAs. Those PCAs who have done Diploma Course and/or Six Week Certificate Course, were instructed to apply for Three Week Refresher Course. And those PCAs, who have not done any course in the past, were asked to apply for a Six Week Certificate Course.

The 1st Phase of the Capacity Building Program for PCAs hired in KICs was conducted from 04.12.2023 till 24.02.2024 which included 6 Weeks Certificate Course (6 WCC) and 3 Weeks Refresher Course (WRC) in a hybrid manner (Online + Offline). For 6 WCC, it was four weeks of online classes and two weeks of offline classes. For 3 WRC, it was two weeks of online classes and one week of offline classes. The details of the 1st Phase is mentioned below:

Also, it was informed to the States/UTs vide letter no. 126/KIC/Capacity Building of PCAs/2023-24 dated 21.12.2023 (**Annexure-III-C**) that the following are the inclusions for the participating PCAs for the said program:

- 1. Lodging and Boarding Cost for 01 week (03 Week Refresher Course) and for 02 weeks (06 Week Refresher Course) to be borne by SAI
- 2. Course Fee Nil
- 3. Travel Allowance (TA): The TA would be applicable for travel by 3 AC from the place of KIC to the designated Course Centre (to and fro).

The bills and vouchers for the purpose of reimbursement for travel allowance is to be submitted to SAI Regional Centres (RCs) through the States/UTs Sports Department.

The 2nd Phase of Capacity Building Program is tentatively scheduled to commence from December 2024 and is being conducted for those PCAs who were either absent/failed/did not register during the 1st Phase and for the new PCAs. The detailed flow chart of the PCA Capacity Building Course is placed at **Annexure-III-D** in which the failed/absent PCAs are being allowed for another attempt.

However, during the data analysis w.r.t. the absent and failed PCAs of Phase-1, it was found that around 20% of the enrolled PCAs in Phase-1 were absent or failed.

For PCAs who failed the 6 Weeks Certificate Course online exam in Phase-1, 02 reexaminations were offered on 6.04.2024 and 14.06.2024. Therefore, 03 options are proposed:

- i. Providing one more re-exam chance.
- ii. Require repeating the entire course (4 weeks online and 2 weeks offline)







iii. Allowing the PCAs to attend online classes and exams within the 2nd Phase of the program

Further for the absent PCAs of the 01^{st} Phase and PCAs who did not register are to compulsorily attend the 2^{nd} Phase of the program.

Since, in the operational guidelines, Capacity Building Program is not mandatory for the PCAs who are hired in KICs, therefore, the mandatory pre-condition of successful completion of the capacity building program may be recommended to be incorporated in the future hiring process of PCAs by the States/UTs placed before DPAC.

- *i.* Compulsorily register and attend the 2nd Phase of Capacity Building Course for the absent candidates of Phase-1
- ii. 03 options for PCAs who failed the 6 Weeks Certificate Course online exam:
 - a. Providing one more re-exam chance
 - b. Require repeating the entire course (4 weeks online and 2 weeks offline)
 - c. Allowing the PCAs to attend the online classes and exams within the 2nd Phase of the program
- iii. Inclusion of mandatory pre-condition of successful completion of capacity building program in the future hiring process of PCAs by the States/UTs.

Under the component of **Sports Competitions and Talent Development** of Khelo India Scheme mentioned in the Gazette Notification dated 4 March 2022. It is mentioned that the Central Government will organize National-level competitions in respect of high priority/priority sports disciplines. So far 15 editions of **Khelo India Games** have been successfully conducted including 6 editions of Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG), 4 editions of Khelo India University Games (KIUG), 4 editions of Khelo India Winter Games (KIWG) and 1 edition of Khelo India Para Games (KIPG).

- 2. For the smooth conduct of the Games, Sports Authority of India had on-boarded **Strategic Advisors** (for sports event planning) Consultancy in 2022 and contract was further extended for one (01) year. The agency is contracted to provide workforce to Khelo India Division for execution of the Khelo India Games. It is pertinent to mention that the existing contract of the agency expired on **31st July 2024**.
- 3. In view of the ongoing tasks and upcoming editions of the Khelo India Games, it is imperative that the workforce remains available with the Division. Hence, there was a requirement to float a fresh tender for the on boarding of one Strategic Advisor (for sports event planning) Consultancy (5 resources).
- 4. In this regard, the details of funds payable to the agency as per the current contract and the proposed funds requirement for subsequent on boarding of the agency is mentioned as under:

- 5. In context of the above, it is to mention that the amount for on boarding the agency is being catered under the Functional Area (FA) heads of Venue Operations and Games Operations as part of the budget approved by DPAC for conduct of Khelo India Games. It may be noted the budget estimate for the conduct of upcoming editions of the Khelo India Games is yet to be placed before DPAC for consideration and approval.
- 6.In view of the above requirement the approval for allocation of budget amounting to Rs 1.90 Cr for engagement of Strategic Advisors (for sports event planning) Consultancy was obtained by the Chairperson, DPAC/Secretary (Sports), MYAS on file.

Hence the agenda item is being placed before DPAC for ratification.

The digitalization of the Khelo India Scheme holds immense importance in achieving its objectives of mass participation and promoting excellence in sports. Technology driven initiatives can aid in creation of a hassle-free, integrated, transparent and information driven system, thus ensuring the smooth and timely execution of the scheme. In addition, seamless flow of information enables transparency and benefits for all the stakeholders involved.

- 2. In this regard, it may be noted that the Gazette Notification of Khelo India Scheme also places immense importance on the process of digitalization. As per Para XV of Point No. II under section 1.3.2 of Khelo India Gazette Notification, there is a provision to earmark funds for various purposes including maintenance of Online Portal and identification of sporting talent through different avenues and their further development.
- 3. Recognizing the significance of digitalization, a wholistic and thorough assessment of scope of work and required manpower was conducted for digitalization of Khelo India. Accordingly, the agenda containing the same was presented and approved in the 39th DPAC meeting for 1 years for an amount of Rs. 1,97,58,168.
- 4. Thereafter, the manpower was engaged through NICSI Tier III agency, and the digitalization of all the verticals of Khelo India was undertaken for the following modules:
- a. Khelo India Centers and Sports Academies with its attendant sub-modules.
- b. Khelo India Talent Identification with its attendant sub-modules.
- c. Khelo India Accredited Academies with its attendant sub-modules.
- d. FIT India with its attendant sub-modules.
- e. Annual Sports Competition with its attendant sub-modules
- f. Sports For Women Module with its attendant sub-modules.
- 5. The digitization of the Khelo India was undertaken following the standard Software development cycle of functional analysis gathering, preparation of functional/software requirement specification, technical development, User Acceptance Testing (UAT), release in alpha/beta mode and training sessions with the all the stakeholders including academies, states, past champion athletes (PCAs) etc. It is further submitted that at every stage of development cycle, end users were consulted to ensure user-oriented development.
 - 6. Accordingly, a committee was constituted under the Chairmanship of Director (Khelo India) in order to evaluate the work done by the manpower done vis-à-vis scope of work, identify gap analysis, further development work, support and maintenance services and







required manpower.

- 7. In this regard, it may be noted that the scope of work for Khelo India digitization is evolutionary and multi-fold in nature. Further, as the development cycle was interactive in nature (especially with end-users), a significant increase in terms of earlier scope of work was observed.
- 8. In addition, with the launch of KIRTI initiative under Khelo India, which is driven by the IT application for recording assessments and analyzing their performance, there is a requirement for providing support and maintenance and development services including customization for conducting assessments for MCD Schools, CBSE Schools etc.
- 9. It may be also be mentioned that Khelo India Digitization has been undertaken under the National Sports Repository System (NSRS) technology stack in an integrated and comprehensive manner. Therefore, the scope of Khelo India Digitization has expanded to cover the entire Athlete Journey, including every facet of the Sports development from Talent Identification to end-to-end Athlete Management System. In addition, the integration of the Khelo India Digitization has also been planned with other applications like ACTC Portal, TOPS Portal, eSign etc. in order to ensure comprehensive access and overview to Athlete dashboard regarding their performance and support.
- 10. After a detailed examination, the committee identified the following pending tasks including support and maintenance for the existing modules:

11. As the pending scope of work is expansive and vast in nature, it is not possible to complete the same with the existing manpower. The Committee also made a detailed assessment (as per the above scope of work) and examination of the duration, required manpower, and used market research and NICSI Tier III manpower rates to arrive at the estimated cost. The required manpower (along with the designation and brief of their roles and responsibilities and required man-months) along with estimated cost is detailed below:

The above resources would be responsible for providing support and maintenance, development, testing and deployment of various modules of Khelo India digitization including Khelo India Centers and Sports Academies, Khelo India Talent Identification, Khelo India Accredited Academies, Fit India, Annual Sports Competitions and Sports for Women Modules, KIRTI, attendant sub-modules and dashboards, thus ensuring in integrated, transparent flow of information and execution.

Approval of DPAC is solicited for:

i. Financial Approval for Digitalization of Khelo India components at an estimated cost of Rs. 1,97,58,168/- (Rupees One Crore Ninety-Seven Lakhs Fifty-Eight Thousand One Hundred and Sixty-Eight Only) (Inclusive of all) for a period of 12 months

In order to achieve the objective of taking fitness to the masses, various activities are being organised by the Fit India Mission through activities like Fit India Quiz, Fit India Freedom Run, Fit India Week, National Sports Day, etc. It is however felt that there is a need to strengthen the promotional activities being conducted under the Fit India Mission to improve the visibility and strengthen the Fit India brand. The activities that are planned as a part of promotional activities under Fit India are as follows-

- 1. It is proposed that branding elements of Fit India may be placed at various vantage points of SAI Stadia, SAI Regional Centres, SAI NCOEs, SAI STCs, State Bhawans in New Delhi, Archaeological Survey of India sites, etc to improve the visibility of the Fit India brand as well as Fit India Mobile Application.
- 2. Engage with various platforms like MyGov to further enhance the reach of Fit India Mission and greater citizen engagement. Activities like doodle competition, poster making competition, quizzes, etc will be conducted with the winners being awarded cash prizes and various Fit India merchandises.
- 3. The Regional Centres of SAI are active implementation agency and provide operational support to various campaigns and events of Fit India Mission, event specific branding may be done in states under their jurisdictions. Fit India promotional activities are also being carried out during the visit of Hon'ble Ministers, Members of Parliament and Members of Legislative Assemblies.
- 4. Engagements with various Fit India Influencers and other personalities as a part of broader promotion of the Fit India brand and any other activities to be held during the year.
- 5. Promotional activities as a part of various events and campaigns that will be conducted in 2024-25.
- 6. Security upgrades/audit of the Fit India website and Fit India Mobile App and other miscellaneous expenses.

The 39th DPAC in its meeting held on 27.07.2023 had approved an amount of Rupees Seventy-five lakhs (Rs 75 lakhs) for the purpose of promotion of Fit India activities for the year 2023-24. Accordingly, an **expenditure of Rs 62.70 lacs was incurred** under promotional activities of Fit India Mission for the year 2023-24 (**Annexure V**).

In view of the above and considering the activities being planned for current financial year, it is proposed that an **amount of Rs.75.00 lacs (detailed proposal at Annexure V) may be allocated** for various Fit India promotional activities, including procurement of T-shirts, Caps; other branding elements, events, etc. for the financial year 2024-25.

The budget allocation may be made under Fit India vertical of Khelo India.

Reference is invited to the 40th meeting of DPAC held on 23.08.2023, which had approved the budget of Rs 6.69Cr for Fit India Quiz (FIQ) 2023 with a direction that SAI may issue an Expression of Interest (EOI) to raise sponsorship for funding the Fit India Quiz expenditure, especially towards the prize money (**Annexure - VI**)

- 2. Accordingly, with the concurrence of 118th Finance Committee and subsequent approval by the Hon'ble Chairman, GB, the EOI was published on the CPP portal for 15 days. However, no response was received to the EOI and consequently, the EOI was republished for 10 days with an end date of 03.08.2024. Again, no response has been garnered for the EOI for sponsoring the prize money of FIQ 2023.
- 3. In view of the above, with the EOI garnering no response, it is submitted that the distribution process of prize money to the winners of FIQ 2023 may be initiated with the prize money being debited from the Fit India component of the Khelo India Scheme. The 40th DPAC had approved a budget of Rs 6.69Cr for the FIQ 2023 including the prize money of Rs 3.25Cr. According the same is being placed before the DPAC for information.

For Information of DPAC-

The EOI to attract sponsorship for the prize money component of Fit India Quiz 2023 has not garnered any response and the distribution process of prize money to the winners of Fit India Quiz 2023 be initiated with the prize money being debited from the Fit India component of the Khelo India Scheme.

ASMITA Leagues in 2023-24 was organized across 18 disciplines with more than 502 Sports competitions witnessing total participation of over 56325 women athletes. The DPAC in its 35th, 39th and 40th Meeting had approved the organization of leagues in 18 disciplines with a total annual financial implication of Rs. 20 Cr for a period of 4 years with 10% increment each subsequent year.

2. For the year 2024-25, ASMITA league/ tournament/ series are proposed as follows-

The Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) and Sports Authority of India (SAI), under the 'Khelo India' initiative, have successfully conducted various editions of 'Khelo India Games' ("Khelo India Youth Games and Khelo India University Games") with the participation of athletes from 36 States/UTs. The Games became a huge success in no time by creating inspirational value among budding players of the country. Further, Khelo India Winter Games have also been conducted in Jammu & Kashmir. In the same spirit ASMITA city league is also being conducted in various disciplines.

- 2. Vide Khelo India Gazette notification dated 4th March 2022, as per Para 1.3.5. (IV) (i) While all the components of the Khelo India Scheme are gender neutral and afford opportunities to women too for participating in sporting activities and development of sports, competitions, leagues and tournaments for women, as well as other disadvantaged groups may be organized in different disciplines at various levels.
- 3. The organization of regular competition is an important aspect for development of sporting culture; hence, it is important to introduce new competitions to strengthen the existing domestic structure. Therefore, to drive a sustainable sports culture and also to extend the reach of ASMITA league to City and divisional level, popular pockets of concerned disciplines will be identified across India by NSF in consultation with different stakeholders viz SAI , State Govt , Local Authorities for organizing sports competitions for financial year 2024-25.
- 4. It is submitted that ASMITA City League (City/Division Level) was approved in the 39th DPAC and 150 **ASMITA** City Leagues were conducted in 7 Disciplines with the participation of over 25000 women athletes. The overwhelming response to the women leagues has been inspiring. With enthusiasm and passion soaring high, the inaugural league has witnessed an outpouring of support from athletes, fans, and communities alike and this has paved the way for an exciting expansion.
- 5. In response to the overwhelming demand, it is now proposed to conduct 300 ASMITA City Leagues for 2024-25 across the country. This expansion will open up new avenues for countless talented women athletes who aspire to showcase their provess on a national stage and it shall be







endeavored to reach out to untapped regions of our nation.

6. Wherever the NSF is not in position to conduct league, SAI will coordinate for the league with the help of various stakeholders like State Govt., Universities, State Associations, KICs, SLKICs, KIAAs and private clubs, etc.

The salient features of the leagues are as follows:

- 300 Sports competitions will be conducted across India.
- It will provide a platform to the athletes who were unable to participate in national/state level Competitions.
- Reaching untapped geographical areas.
- 7. **Financial Implication**: The budget for each discipline for each city will be as follows-

Further, it is to submit that as per the guidelines of the MYAS under 'Assistance to NSF' Scheme, NSF is eligible for a grant-in-aid for the National Championships for 3 age-categories (Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior) and the NSF/Host State Sports Association concerned is allowed to raise sponsorship in order to ensure the conduct of the event. However, for the ASMITA City league at City/ Divisional level, the funding is being limited to an amount of Rs. 50,000/- per event even though the requirement to conduct the event is almost similar, it is proposed that Organizing unit be permitted to raise sponsorship towards the available rights subject to following of the guidelines issued by Khelo India for branding/publicity. However, if NSF gets any title sponsor, the name of the event shall only be "ASMITA City League" and the rights may be used as "Sponsored By / Powered By / Co-Powered By" etc.

8. DG SAI, may be authorized to decide no. of disciplines and no. of cities (Up to 50 Cities per discipline) as per viability, feasibility and interested entities.

- i. Financial Approval of Rs. 50, 000/- per league towards the conduct of 300 ASMITA City Leagues. Tentative financial implication will be Rs. 1,50,00,000/- (50,000*300 leagues)
- ii. Director General, SAI may be authorized to allow expenditure up to 10% beyond the approved amount for leagues approved for 2024-25 and the nature of expenditure as well.

To encourage and motivate the participating women athletes, prize money is an important component of the ASMITA Leagues. In this regard the ASMITA Football League 2023-24 was conducted in 87 cities after the approval of the 39th DPAC as per the financial implication mentioned below:

2. Post completion of the league, a total of 3360 beneficiaries were finalised by the All-India Football Federation (AIFF)who were eligible to receive the above-mentioned prize money, the detailed prize structure of which is as under:

- 3. It is submitted that AIFF to date has provided the bank details of 908 winning athletes and the bank details of 2452 athletes are awaited from AIFF. It is also pertinent to note that AIFF has issued multiple reminders to winning teams and was not able to receive the bank details of the players who were part of the Champions/Runner-Up teams. In this regard, a public notice was issued by AIFF on 22nd March 2024 requesting the bank details of the players. It was also directed by AIFF that in case the players do not have bank accounts, they shall open the account in their name and send the details to AIFF by 6th June 2024 and failure to do so within the stipulated time shall result in the forfeiture of the prize money.
- 4. Thereafter, AIFF has informed vide letter dated 6th August 2024 that the prize money of the athletes whose bank details are not available may be considered for forfeiture. Accordingly, the proposal was sent to DG, SAI who has directed that the agenda to forfeit the prize money of the athletes whose bank account details have not been provided by AIFF for ASMITA Football League 2023-24 be placed before the DPAC before action.
 - 5. To ameliorate this problem of the collection of bank details of athletes, the ASMITA portal (www.sfw.gov.in) has been developed wherein all the participating athletes have to register on the NSRS Portal, submit the bank account details mandatorily and nominate themselves for the







interested league. The NSFs must approve the participation of the athletes on the portal, upload the results and submit the list of the winning athletes for disbursing the prize money. Further functionality is being built into the portal to inform the beneficiary of the successful transfer of prize money through SMS and/or e-mail. This practice is being implemented for the ASMITA Leagues being conducted in the current year i.e. FY 2024-25.

i. Forfeit the prize money of Rs 48,07,346 to the athletes whose bank account details have not been provided by AIFF for ASMITA Football League 2023-24
