



Minutes of the DPAC Meeting of Khelo India dated 04.06.2019

Secretary (Sports) Shri R. S. Julaniya chaired DPAC meeting of Khelo India on 04/06/2019. The list of members who attended the meeting is at the end.

2. After deliberations following decisions were taken to promote indigenous and traditional sports:

2.1. Mallakhamb:

DPAC decided to approve the following:

- i. One-time grant to NSF for infrastructure creation/upgradation @ Rs. 2.50 lakhs per centre for 100 centres amounting to Rs. 2.50 crores. Infrastructure would inter-alia include akharas, vyayamshala, consumables, equipment's, etc.
- ii. Grant to NSF for training of 120 coaches @ Rs. 10,000 per coach amounting to Rs. 12.00 lakhs. The training programme would be for five days.
- iii. To provide one coach each in the 5 top States where Mallakhamb is played with annual grant for 3 years @Rs. 5.00 lakhs per annum per State. The total grant amount to NSF will be Rs. 75.00 lakhs.
- iv. Grant to NSF for Sports kit for 100 athletes each in 100 centres total for 10,000 athletes @Rs. 1,000/- per athlete. This will amount to Rs. 1.00 crore.
- v. There are 48 medal winners in Sub junior and 54 medal winners in junior category in the last National championship organized by the Federation. These sportspersons to be provided monthly scholarships @ 10,000 per month under Khelo India for a period of one year. In future scholarship for a period of one year to be provided to a maximum of 105 medal winners in Sub junior/junior category in the following National Championships.

2.2 Kalarippayattu

DPAC decided to approve the following:

- i. Grant to NSF for setting up of 2 Kalaris @ Rs. 40.00 lakhs per centre amounting to Rs. 80.00 lakhs. Infrastructure would inter-alia include construction of sports arena for

indoor stadium, office space, bathrooms, sports specific equipment, etc. 50% of this amount will be given as an advance and balance 50% after receipt of UC of 70%. The setup of these Kalaris should be completed by March, 2020.

- ii. To provide 2 coaches (1 male and 1 female) in each of the 2 Kalaris with annual grant for 3 years @Rs. 5.00 lakhs per annum per coach. Total grant amount will be Rs. 60.00 lakhs.
- iii. There are 24 medal winners in Sub junior and 54 medal winners in junior category in the last National championship organized by the Federation. These sportspersons to be provided monthly scholarships @ 10,000 per month under Khelo India for a period of one year. In future, scholarship for a period of one year to be provided to a maximum of 80 medal winners in Sub junior/junior category in the following National Championships.

2.3 Gatka

DPAC decided to approve the following:

- i. Grant to NSF for training of 120 coaches @ Rs. 5,000 per coach amounting to Rs. 6.00 lakhs. The training programme would be for 5 days.
- ii. To provide grant for 2 coaches (one coach and one instructor) for each of the 3 academies (1 in Haryana and 2 in Punjab) @ Rs. 5.00 lakhs per coach amounting to total Rs. 30.00 lakhs.
- iii. One-time grant to NSF for two sets of equipment in each of the 3 academies @ Rs. 5.00 lakhs per academy. The total grant amount will be Rs. 15.00 lakhs
- iv. There are 180 medal winners in Sub junior and 180 medal winners in junior category in the last National championship organized by the Federation. Federation will identify approximate 100 winners who will be provided monthly scholarships @ 10,000 per month under Khelo India for a period of one year. In future, scholarship for a period of one year to be provided to a maximum of 100 medal winners in Sub junior/junior category in the following National Championships.

2.4 Thang-Ta

DPAC decided to approve the following:

- i. Imphal centre to be converted into day boarding academy.
- ii. Grant of Rs. 10.00 lakh to NSF for training of coaches to conduct training programme of 5 days.
- iii. One-time grant to NSF for infrastructure creation/upgradation including equipment @ Rs. 5.00 lakhs per academy for each of the 3 academies (In Assam, Manipur and Tripura) amounting to Rs. 15.00 lakh.
- iv. To provide 2 coaches (1 male and 1 female) in each of the 3 academies with annual grant to NSF for 1 year @Rs. 5.00 lakh per coach amounting to total Rs. 30.00 lakh.
- v. There are 24 medal winners in Sub junior and 24 medal winners in junior category in the last National championship organized by the Federation. These sportspersons would be provided monthly scholarships @ 10,000 per month under Khelo India for a period of one year. In future scholarship for a period of one year to be provided to maximum of 50 medal winners in Sub junior/junior category in the following National Championships.

3. The proposal from Bodoland Indigenous Games Association was not found eligible for sanction. Dragonboat Federation of India was advised to re-work the proposal keeping in mind holistic development of indigenous sports and with broad parameters such as infrastructure creation/upgradation, coach development programmes, assistance for academies, etc.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
