

**Implementation Guidelines for notification of Khelo India Centre  
(KIC)**

The revamped Khelo India Scheme was notified vide the Gazette of India dated 14.10.2017, envisages establishment of State level Khelo India Centres (SLKICs) as one of the 12 verticals of Khelo India to maximize the utilization of Sports infrastructure set up by the respective State/UTs. SLKIC is implemented at mega and small level to ensure better utilization of sports infrastructure throughout the country.

Under the Small level centres, one of the existing training centres in the districts of the State/UTs would be designated as Khelo India Centre (KIC) under SLKIC. In the scheme, sports training mechanism is envisaged wherein past “champion athletes” would become coaches and mentors for youngsters, running sports training in an autonomous manner and earn their livelihood.

The scheme has three verticals of implementation

1. Conversion of existing SAI Extension Centres into Khelo India Centres
2. Existing training centres as New Khelo India Centres with Past Champion Athletes/trainers
3. Support to organizations promoting sports for atleast 5 years

The Financial Assistance of the Scheme

1. One-time non-recurring grant of Rs. 5 Lakhs per discipline for preparation/upgradation of sports field & purchase of sports equipment.
2. Recurring grant of Rs. 5 Lakhs per discipline for remuneration of coaches/champion athletes, purchase of consumable sports equipment. Maximum remuneration permitted per Champion Athletes would be Rs. 3 Lakhs per annum (i.e., Rs. 25,000/- per month)

The process of implementation is as follows: -

1. The application in the prescribed proformas are forwarded to the Khelo India Secretariat duly signed by the Director (Sports) of the respective States/UTs.
2. The information may be submitted initially for one centre with one discipline in each district.
3. An internal committee/ Project Appraisal Committee (PAC) formed by SAI shall review the details furnished for each centre and select the best centre from the proposals submitted by the state.
4. The shortlisted centre in each district of State/ UTs is placed before the Departmental Project Approval Committee (DPAC) for approval to notify the centres as KIC of the district in the state/UT.
5. Once the Centres are approved by DPAC, The sanction is released and thereafter Champion Athletes may be hired as per the guidelines.
6. In North-east, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh initially two centres in each district with one game is considered.

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**Implementation Guidelines for notification of Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE)**

The revamped Khelo India Scheme was notified vide the Gazette of India dated 14.10.2017, envisages establishment of State level Khelo India Centres (SLKICs) as one of the 12 verticals of Khelo India to maximize the utilization of Sports infrastructure set up by the respective State/UTs. SLKIC is implemented at mega and small level to ensure better utilization of sports infrastructure throughout the country.

Under the Mega level centres, one of the existing training centres in State/UTs would be designated as Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE) under SLKIC. Under the partnership with State/UT, the notified KISCE will be provided financial support for Sports science backup, engagement of coaches & support staff, sports equipment etc. Whereas lodging, regular maintenance, infrastructure upgradation, etc. and overall management will be looked after by the State. Wherever required, SAI will provide its technical expertise and assistance.

The process of implementation is as follows: -

- i. A letter along with Detailed Project Report (DPR) proformas are released to the State seeking the details of 3 potential centres which could be funded under the KISCE component. The potential centres are expected to have best facilities for sports training in the following fields:
  - a. Infrastructure/training facilities available at the centre for each sport.
  - b. Coaching and Support staff employed by the centre
  - c. Past performance of the athletes trained at the centre at national/international level.
- ii. An internal committee/ Project Appraisal Committee (PAC) formed by SAI shall review the details furnished for each centre and select one best centre from the proposals submitted by the state. Preference is accorded to the centre having facilities for sport included in the 14 priority disciplines.
- iii. The DPR of the shortlisted centre is placed before the Departmental Project Approval Committee (DPAC) for approval to notify the centres as KISCE of the state.
- iv. After the approval from DPAC, SAI conducts a detailed inspection of the centre for funding of the centre in coordination with the concerned State department and an estimate cost of intervention is prepared known as Viability Gap Funding.
- v. The assessment report along with the estimated Viability Gap Funding, after completion of necessary verification and inspection, is placed before the DPAC for approval.
- vi. Upon approval of the identified gaps and the financial estimates from DPAC, the sanction for funding for the excellence centre is issued by SAI

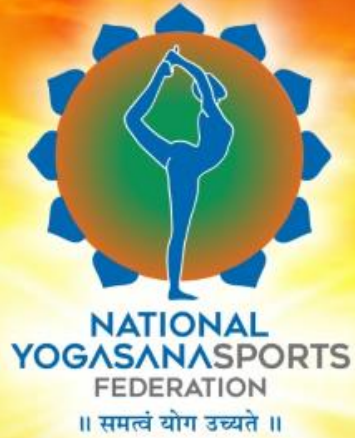

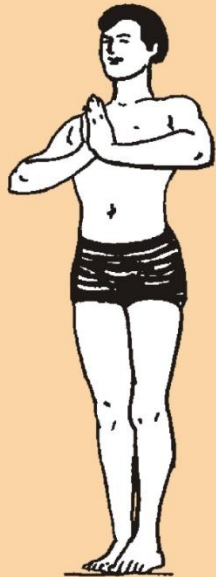

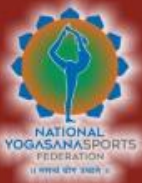

## **Proposed Draft Concept Paper for KHELOINDIA National Ranking Women Archery Tournament**

### Concern:

Analysing the participation data, it has been found that the participation of women in National, State, University and School level events is less than that of men, which is also a matter of concern of the World Archery. It has also been seen that only a few women dominate the Indian team. It is matter of concern to note that we do not have a sufficient number of Women Coaches and Women National/International Judges too. Although situation is changing steadily with passing day but it is not enough. In spite of winning a number of medals by women athletes at the highest level of sports events, some people are still believed that women have neither strong nor competitive enough to participate in sport events. In some parts of the country, parents do not allow girls freely to come into sport field due to religious and cultural rites.

Like majority of the sport discipline, in Archery, only one National Championship (Senior/Junior/Cadet category) and State Championships/Trials are generally available resulted Archers get very limited competition where they can show their talent and prowess. However, the Association is soon going to start four National Ranking Tournaments with a final in a year giving equal opportunity to top male and female archers of country.

### Objective & Vision:

The main objective for submission of this concept paper is that women's participation in sport events has a positive impact in the overall performance of a country. Time has now come when we should put concerted efforts to attract more and more women towards sports by generating their interests. We need to have more competition exposures at domestic levels for second, third and fourth lines of Archers, inculcating the Exclusive Women events which should be played, coached and judged by women in the line of Women Empowerment.

### Advantage and impact:

The increasing rates of female athletes' participation in sport events help counter gender biases. Furthermore, it has been observed that women that do sports and participate in Archery events are, besides improving their physical & mental health, more likely to overcome biases, feel empowered and develop leadership skills. This will ultimately help developing a winning mindset and identify talent.

This initiative will surely yield fruitful results in the long run not only to attract and motivate the youth towards archery and help in grooming the talent of the region but will also help in bringing the proportion of women to men in the sport of Archery.

### Eligible Participants:

40 Women Archers in Senior, Junior and Sub-Junior (Cadet) age group in Recurve and Compound divisions to be allowed to participate.

- Total expected archers = 40WR + 40WC = 80 archers
- Total expected archers = 40JWR + 40JWC = 80 archers
- Total expected archers = 40CWR + 40CWC = 80 archers

Archery Association of India is in the process of reviewing the process from where 40 archers in each category will be selected to play. The Association will revert on the eligibility as soon as we arrive at a final conclusion. The possibility of allowing a few more archers to perform for the competition cannot be ruled out for now.

Foreign Participation – We may open the competition to Foreign Archers who would like to come and compete. They may win the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> position prizes subject to get approval and much required support from the GoI.

**Duration of Competition:**

2 days (1<sup>st</sup> day – Qualification and 2<sup>nd</sup> Day – Round Robin elimination)

**Occurrence:**

Once every 2 months according to International and National Calendar of Events.

**Tentative Point System:**

Give points for top 16 ranks (8 to 0.5 points) and for the last & final Women NRT only top 16 can participate based on points accumulated in 1<sup>st</sup> five NRTs. Also, AAI may consider to allow top archers from the KI Women NRT to participate in the NTPC NRTs being conducted who are not part of that. The point system will be reconsidered within the AAI.

Group A – Top 8 archers

Group B: Archers from 9 to 16

Group C: Archers from 17 to

24 Group D: Archers ranked 25 to 32

Group E: Archers ranked 33 to 40

#### **Day 2:**

1<sup>st</sup> half – Round robin matches amongst top 12 archers – total 11 matches to be played, in which 6 matches in first half (8:30 AM -12:00 PM ) and 5 matches in 2<sup>nd</sup> half – (2.00pm –5.00 pm)

Round Robin amongst losers of Group B, C, D & E on separate field to decide the ranking. Ranking from 13 to 16 decided based on the winner from each group and their Qualification ranking.

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**Roles and Responsibilities**

**A. SAI**

- i. Federation will finalize the league structure and location in consultation with SAI. The funding to be provided by SAI to Archery Association of India as per approval of DPAC;
- ii. Approval of backdrop, parameter board, logo size, position etc. will be approved by SAI on a one-time basis.

**B. Federation**

- i. The entire conduct and organization of the league will be done by the federation. The federation will ensure smooth technical conduct through qualified referees and will supervise the leagues, maintain audit of accounts, disbursement of all grants and utilization Certificate etc.
- ii. The federation will be responsible for scheduling of matches, recce of stadiums/venues for equipment requirements etc. The federation will ensure registration of the participants, conduct, results, management of database, publicity etc.
- iii. They will come up with the minimum benchmark and ensure the same are followed.
- iv. The federation will be free to raise the sponsorship to support the league. The branding and sponsorship model will require one-time approval. While deciding the sponsorship model or commitment of expenditure, the long-term viability must be kept in mind. The participating teams will be allowed to have the logo on their apparel.
- v. The central sponsorship opportunity for different sponsors will be in the form of “**Supported by.....**”, “**Powered by.....**”. There may be more sponsors for various activities and separate sponsors for the leagues in different cities.
- vi. The branding of Khelo India will be decided depending upon the size of league & expenditure involved. However, at least 50% of the branding will be available for raising sponsorship/local authorities.
- vii. Competition report at the end of league & two min AV with required highlights.

**C. State Government/**

- i. Playfields (without rentals or with rentals to be managed by the authorities).
- ii. All permissions/ clearance to conduct of the league.
- iii. Supporting NSFs for sponsorship etc

iv. Publicity

**D. Participating Team/player**

- i. It is expected that the teams are trained regularly to rise up to the standard of the game.
- ii. The teams/player will manage local travel, refreshment, medical kit etc. on their own. If, the team is from outstation, the accommodation and transportation will be managed by them at their own cost. The matches will be organized at regular interval which needs to be noted.
- iii. If the teams own the ground, the same shall be provided free of cost to the NSF.
