SUB: Physical Inspection and Annual Evaluation Matrix for Khelo India State Centres of Excellence (KISCEs)

As part of India's pursuit for excellence in Olympics and endeavour to scale up State/UT government's existing best academies to world standard, Khelo India State Centres of Excellence (KISCE) have been notified and provided financial support for Sports science back-up, engagement of coaches and support staff, sports equipment, etc. based on viability gap assessment.

### Physical Inspection of KISCEs

In this endeavour it is imperative to put in place a robust monitoring mechanism that ensures that the desired objectives are attained. In this context, it may be noted that physical inspections of Khelo India Centres are vital for ensuring quality, safety, compliance, and accountability in the program.

## 2. Objectives of Physical Inspection exercise:

- i. *Quality Assurance*: Inspections help ensure that the training centres are built and maintained to the required standards.
- ii. Safety: Physical inspections help identify potential safety hazards and issues that could pose risks to athletes and coaches.
- iii. *Compliance*: Inspections help ensure that the training centres adhere to the guidelines and regulations set by the government or sports authorities.
- iv. *Accountability*: Regular inspections create accountability among the authorities responsible for managing the training centres.
- v. *Transparency*: Regular inspections contribute to transparency in the functioning of the training centres.

## 3. Frequency of Physical Inspections:

At least twice per KISCE in a year, ideally every 6 months. Number of inspections/ visits may be increased if required.

## 4. Physical Inspection Template:

Additionally, Evaluation matrices play a crucial role in providing structure, objectivity, and data-driven insights for sports academies at the grassroots level. They aid in player

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development, talent identification, progress tracking, data analysis, and fostering a culture of excellence and growth.

### 5. Operationalisation of KISCEs

Based on the inspection/ National Sports Repository System (NSRS) data, KISCEs will be tagged either as operational or non-operational. A training centre initially tagged as operational may be changed to non-operational in case the fulfilment conditions get altered afterwards. The criteria to tag a centre operational is as below:

- b. Add transparency: clear goals and benchmarks to achieve to foster a culture of continuous improvement
- c. Inspire progress: take proactive measures to encourage KICs & KISCEs to further their development

### 7. Scoring Methodology:

The Khelo India State Centres of Excellence will primarily be assessed in key areas like: number of athletes being trained, coach certification, deployment of an Athlete Management Software, usage of sports science facilities, compliance, equipment quantity, athlete quality and achievements. The parameters for evaluation of KISCEs are mentioned below:

## 8. Categories:

Based on the scores attained in the evaluation matrix, KICs & KISCEs will be classified in the following tiers:

Tier	Marks Range
Tier I	More than 75% points
Tier II	Between 50-75% points
Tier III	Below 50% points

## 9. Key Points

- Data available on National Sports Repository System (NSRS) with respect to disciplines, number of athletes, number of coaches, manpower, etc. shall be the sole source for awarding points for the evaluation matrix.
- For KISCEs, data for the 03 One State One Game (OSOG) disciplines available and which are sanctioned in the KISCE shall be included for evaluation.
- Points for manpower hired and equipment procured for KISCEs shall be awarded on the basis of information submitted by the respective KISCEs and the status of Utilisation Certificate settlement.
- iv. The list of tournaments approved by the National Sports Federation (NSF) or the State Sports Association shall only be evaluated for awarding points for Achievements. Invitational/private tournaments will not be considered for points calculation.

# 10. Scoring Committee

The scoring of KISCEs shall be done by the respective SAI Regional Centres primarily through NSRS and supplemented by physical visits to the KISCEs along with obtaining necessary information through the respective State/UT Sports department. SAI RCs will send the consolidated scores attained by each KISCE to the SAI Head Office.
