#### **Detailed Description of Agenda:**

Reference is drawn to **sub clause IV of para 1.3.4 of Gazette Notification** of Khelo India Scheme dated 4<sup>th</sup> March 2022 which provides for institutionalizing and funding **Fit India Quizzes and related activities with commensurate price money awards** under the Fit India Moment Component.

In pursuance of above, Fit India Quiz was launched in 2021 as a part of commemorating 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mohotsav', it was envisaged to propagate the message of Fit India among the school children and strengthen its presence in schools, a Fit India Quiz has been envisioned to involve school children across the country. Fit India Quiz is dedicated to the school students where students with interest in sports and fitness can participate and compete at state and national level.FIT India Quiz comprised of preliminary rounds, state level rounds and national rounds, thus making it one of the most comprehensive and flagship quiz programs on fitness and sports in the country. In the **first edition of Fit India Quiz, 36,299 students from 13,502 school participated** and showcased their knowledge in fitness and sports.

In the second edition of **Fit India Quiz, 61,981 students from 16,702 school participated** in the mobile based Preliminary Round which was conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA) which was held on 08th December and 09th December 2022. Post preliminary rounds, 348 schools were selected, which subsequently competed in 120 web rounds and 36 State and UT winners were identified. The 36 State and UT Champions thereafter competed in the National Finals and the National Champions of the Fit India Quiz 2022 were identified. The Fit India Quiz National Rounds were recorded at STAR TV studios from 23rd July to 31st July 2023 in Mumbai. The 13 episodes of National Finals are being telecasted on Star Sports and Hotstar starting from 12<sup>th</sup> August 2023.

As Fit India Quiz has become a popular mechanism to align the kids across the country to join this mission of fitness and adopt the fit lifestyle. Hence it has been decided to have the third edition of Fit India Quiz with its launch on 29<sup>th</sup> August 2023 with an endeavor to reach out to higher number of schools with greater participation from every state and district of the country. Following sub-agendas under Fit India Quiz are proposed for approval:

## i. Structure of Fit India Quiz:

Fit India Quiz shall comprise of school round (registration), preliminary rounds, state rounds and national rounds, thus making it one of the most comprehensive and flagship quiz programs on fitness and sports in the country. The brief description of the 4 rounds is provided below:







**a.** School Registration: To be conducted by the school to select students for registration in the Fit India Quiz Preliminary Round. It is the responsibility of the school that they encourage maximum students to participate in the Fit India Quiz 2023.

b. **Preliminary Round:** To be a multiple-choice mobile based online round conducted by the National Testing Agency (India's premiere examination body that conducts national-level exams such as JEE and NEET). The country-wide quiz will be organized in 13 languages for benefit of students studying in regional-medium schools.

c. **State Round:** Schools selected in the preliminary round in the state/UT merit list to compete for state/UT championship through series of web rounds. For each state/UT, a specific number of schools to be selected in proportion to the number of schools participating in the preliminary rounds from the state/UT (Refer Annexure I). The state/UT rounds comprising quarter finals, semi-finals and finals to be conducted on a customized web platform and each round to be hosted by a professional quiz master. A dedicated agency to be hired through public procurement to conduct the state/UT rounds.

d. **National Round:** National round in which the winning team of each State/UT will participate and compete for the Champion's title of FIT INDIA QUIZ 2023. First Runner Up and Second Runner Up prizes will also be decided. This will be a grand event to be hosted by a Celebrity Quiz Master. The series for National Rounds to be produced and telecasted on national TV.

The detailed Fit India Quiz 2023 structure is provided at Annexure-I.

In this context, after due deliberation, it has been proposed to initiate the registration for the third edition of Fit India Quiz on 29<sup>th</sup> August 2023 to 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2023 and reaching out to higher number of schools, envisioning greater participation from every state and district from the country.

# ii. Engaging National Testing Agency for Fit India Quiz 2023 registration and conducting preliminary rounds

As in the earlier two editions, in order to maintain the fairness in the examination process and strengthen the credibility of Fit India Quiz, the National Testing Agency (NTA) is to be engaged on nomination basis in accordance with the GFR - rule number 194.

In the first edition of Fit India Quiz 2021, National Testing Agency was engaged for registration and conducting preliminary round in the first edition of Fit India Quiz at the per student fees of Rs 50/-. In the first edition of Fit India Quiz, the registration fees for first 2 students from each school was waived off and was borne by the Fit India Mission. School registering more than 2 students, had to pay the registration fees of Rs 50 per students for over and above 2 students registering for Fit India Quiz.

In the 2nd edition of Fit India Quiz 2022, the NTA was entrusted to conduct the Preliminary Round. The NTA agreed to conduct the preliminary round for Fit India Quiz 2022. The National Testing Agency proposed to complete the registration and examination at a per-student cost of Rs 70/- (Rupees Seventy Only) where Rs.50/- (Rupees Fifty Only) was collected from the students







directly through the payment gateway of NTA and the rest Rs 20/- (Rupees Twenty Only) was borne by Fit India Mission.

Based on the successful and credible execution of first and second edition of Fit India Quiz, it is proposed to onboard National Testing Agency for third edition of Fit India Quiz. It is further proposed that the NTA collects the registration fees Rs 100 per student from the schools directly. No additional amount shall be paid by Fit India Mission.

A separate agenda for engaging National Testing Agency in the third edition of Fit India on nomination basis in accordance with the GFR 194 will be placed before Finance Committee for approval.

# iii. Execution of National Rounds for Fit India Quiz 2023:

In the first & second edition of Fit India Quiz, the production and telecast of National Round had been done by Star India Pvt Ltd. The production and telecast partner of Fit India Quiz 2023 is yet to be decided.

#### **Detailed Description of Agenda:**

## I. **FIT India Freedom Run**

Fit India Freedom Run was conceived in August 2020 when the entire nation started following social distancing in a 'new normal' lifestyle, so as to keep the imperative need of fitness active even while following the social distancing norms, Fit India Freedom Run was launched on the concept of virtual run i.e; 'it can be run anywhere, anytime! You run a route of your choice, at a time that suits you. Basically, you run your own race and time your own pace'.

2. The first edition of the campaign was held from 15th August to 2nd October, 2020 where Central/State Departments and organizations including Armed Forces, NGOs, Private Organizations, Schools, Individuals, Youth Clubs, etc. actively participated in the campaign. More than 5 crore people participated and covered around 18 crore kms run.

3. The second edition was held from 13th August 2021 to 2nd October 2021 where in addition to the virtual run with support of partner organizations, as part of the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, 75 physical events were also organized at iconic locations to Freedom struggle and national importance on launch day. More than 9 crore people participated and covered around 20 crore kms run.

4. The third edition of the Freedom Run was held from 02nd October 2022 and culminated with National Unity Day on 31st October 2022. More than 7 crore people participated in Freedom Run 3.0

5. The fourth edition of the Freedom Run is proposed to be held from 02nd October 2023 and culminate with National Unity Day on 31st October 2023. Similar to previous editions, Central/State Departments and organizations including Armed Forces, NGOs, Private Organizations, Schools, Individuals, Youth Clubs, NYKS, KVS, etc. shall be roped in to inaugurate the Freedom Run 4.0 with plog run on 02nd October 2023 across the country, culminating with the Unity run on 31st October 2023. Estimated expenditure for organizing opening ceremony is approximately Rs.50 lakhs (inclusive of GST). Expectations from State/UTs Governments, Ministries/Departments & Organisations:

• Appoint one Nodal officer for coordination with Fit India Mission and forward the details at contact@fitindia.gov.in.

• States/Ministries/Organizations to conduct physical / virtual Freedom Run events

• Organizers to register their RUN on Fit India portal with details of participants and `kms covered

- Promote Freedom Run on their social media channels with #Run4India
- Adequate publicity for the program through Social Media, Regional TV/Newspaper, etc.
- Ensure participation at Panchayati/Municipality level, Schools/Colleges, Youth Clubs, Selfhelp Groups etc.
- Ensure the momentum of the campaign from 02nd October 2023 to 31st October 2023

## II. FIT India Week

Fit India Week 2023 formally known as Fit India School Week, has been proposed to enhance the outreach of the Mission in broader spectrum by engaging colleges and universities this year for the 5th Edition.

Fit India School Week was conceived in 2019 with the imperative need of creating awareness about fitness not limited to children but also their parents, teachers and school staff. In this campaign, school fraternities across the country are encouraged to celebrate 4 to 6 days in a week to promote a healthy and active lifestyle by indulging in various activities such as debates, quiz, essay writing, poster-making competitions, yoga and meditation, pledge of fitness, indigenous sports etc.

More than 15,000 schools participated in the 1st edition of Fit India School week. In the 2nd edition, more than 4.3 lakh schools celebrated the Fit India school week across the nation. The 3rd edition witnessed more than 4.5 lakh participants across from all over India. The 4th Edition more than 5.56 Lakhs schools celebrated the Fit India School week. Further, more than 39 Member of Parliament had been participated in the different Fit India School Week 4<sup>th</sup> edition events conducted at the school level. All four editions where a big success as huge participation was seen from schools of all states. Along with Children, Teachers, Staff and Parents also took part in this celebration and promoted Fit India Movement in a grand manner.

This year, the 5th edition of Fit India Week (For schools, colleges and universities) shall be observed from 15th November to 15th December 2023. Schools can select any one week within this window to celebrate the Fit India school week program. A launch event for "Fit India School week" is proposed to be organized in a school/college in Delhi or other State/UT. It is also proposed to amplify the campaign across various platforms to spread awareness and increase participation from schools and colleges. A budget of Rs 80 lacs (inclusive of GST), (40 lakhs for the School and 40 lakhs for the Universities) may thus be allotted for the execution of launch event in Delhi and other events the amplification of the campaign.







Additionally, it is also proposed to organize Fit India Week events in all 36 States/UTs through regional centres of SAI, to promote the campaign at the regional level. A budget of Rs. 20 lacs (inclusive of GST) @ approximately Rs. 55,000/- per State/UT may be allotted as a grant to be provided to SAI Regional Centers for the execution of school week events in 36 States/UTs towards branding, production cost (cameraman, videographer, photographer, regional amplification), etc.

A total budget of Rs. 1 cr. (inclusive of GST) is estimated for the Fit India Week 2023.

#### **Detailed Description of Agenda:**

The e-Khel Pathshala is a digital sports education initiative under Khelo India Scheme setup with an objective to provide accessible, standardised, level-based online sports training at grassroots for Physical Education Teachers (PETs), Community Coaches, School students/budding sportspersons, parents, and sports enthusiasts. Under the component of Sports Competitions and Talent Development of the Khelo India Scheme, Gazette Notification dated 4th March 2022, Section 1.3.2, Para II, Point v provides for 'Grassroots talent development through e-Khel Pathshala and Khelo India District Centres'.

2. The e-Khel Pathshala program was structured by aligning the Sport Specific courses with Training Program for Physical Education Teachers and Community Coaches. The program was structured into four levels namely, Introductory Level, Foundation Level, Level 1 and Level 2. Subsequently, the nomenclature of the courses Level 1 and Level 2 was changed to Pre Basic Sports Coaching Course and Basic Sports Coaching Course respectively.

3. The content for e-Khel Pathshala Pre Basic Sports Coaching Course was developed in 3 sports namely, Archery, Boxing and Table Tennis, which included ready content for Table Tennis was provided by Ultimate Table Tennis (Knowledge Partner).

4. DPAC in its meeting dated 14.02.2022 accorded approval for development of high-quality video content for digital coaching modules of the e-Khel Pathshala courses - Introductory Level, Foundation Level, Level 2 (Basic Sports Coaching Course) for 3 sports (Archery, Boxing and Table Tennis) from scratch. And additional content requirements for Level 1 (Pre Basic Sports Coaching Course) including sports science content.

Further, DPAC in its meeting dated 12.04.2022 decided that funding for development of content may be done through Khelo India for e-Khel Pathshala.

#### **Current Status**

#### 5. Users

A total of 150 PETs/Community Coaches have completed the Pre Basic Sports Coaching Course and duly issued the Certificate of Completion. The feedback from users has been positive towards the program and the users are willing to join more such courses and across more disciplines.







## 6. Content

The content for all e-Khel Pathshala courses is developed by Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) engaged by LNCPE Trivandrum and NSNIS Patiala, in association with Content Management Agency (CMA). The development of content for each subject has undergone various stages including designing of curriculum, detailed composition of content literature, on-site shooting, editing/post-production and multiple review rounds to finalise the deliverable content. The status of content development is as under:

## 7. Platform/LMS

To widen the reach of the program by introducing it to a larger audience base of interested participants, a suitable platform i.e., Learning Management System (LMS) shall be required for delivering content and easy accessibility of courses for the users. The system must be capable of handling 15,000 users and have scalability to 10 Lakh users. A market survey was conducted to identify reasonable service providers on the basis of which the cost for procurement has been estimated.

(The details of the features and cost estimated is placed at Annexure II-D)

## 8. Content

Based on the feedback from users and stakeholders, there is demand for learning through digital coaching modules across more sports. In this regard, NSNIS has proposed to develop content for 10 new sports, in addition to the current 3 sports. The content shall be developed for 10 new sports across two course levels namely, Pre Basic Sports Coaching Course (PBSCC) and Basic Sports Coaching Course (BSCC). The cost estimate for content development is based on the previously developed content.

# 9. Course Management

The program operations shall be managed by a set of JCs and YPs based in SAI HO, LNCPE and NSNIS. It is pertinent to mention that the contract of the current workforce shall end in Oct-Nov of current year. In case of PBSCC and BSCC, the users shall be assessed for their skill learning in the chosen sport. Accordingly, there shall be a requirement of engagement of qualified coaches/assessors to guide, assist and evaluate the users based on the performance of the skill. The proposed ratio is kept at 1 Assessor per 100 Users.

## 10. Costing

11. It is stated that the above are indicative amounts and final amount may vary based on the number of users registered & on boarded, nature of disciplines, number & nature of courses designed by subject matter experts. Recommendation and appraisal of DPAC is solicited for allocation of funds to Khelo India for development and management of programs at Rs. 943.04 Lakhs. Out of this amount it is expected that approximately 35% of the total budget, i.e. Rs. 330 lakhs shall be required in the current F.Y. Any additional funds requirement shall be put up subsequently.

12. In respect of the learning management system, it is stated that the current expenditure is for 15,000 user licenses and 2 TB storage. Further, every extra GB of storage will cost Rs. 8 per month and every additional user will cost Rs. 25 per month. The billing of the LMS service shall be applicable on actual basis.

Khelo India Women's league has been organized last year across 13 disciplines with 252 Sports competitions witnessing total participation of 23267 women athletes. The DPAC in its various meetings approved organization of leagues in 14 disciplines with total annual financial implication of Rs. 21.29 Cr for a period of 4 years with 10% increment each subsequent year.

The objectives of the proposed events are:

- To increase the participation of women in Sports by organizing various leagues
- To utilize the leagues as a platform for Identification of new talents and evaluation of existing Khelo India athletes.
- To provide competition exposure to women athletes of different age categories across the Country

For the year 2023-24 Khelo India Women's league are proposed as follows:

a) Disciplines which were approved from 2022-23 to 2025-26, however the NSF has proposed the league with partial modification – For Weightlifting (Approved in 33<sup>rd</sup> DPAC), IWLF has proposed (Annexure-III-A) following modifications in format and budget for session 2023-24.

Khelo India State Centre of Excellence (KISCE) is a project which is a part of India's pursuit for excellence in Olympics and endeavor is to scale up State's best academies to world standard. The DPAC vide its 29th meeting dated 23.09.2021 and 37th meeting dated 21.11.2023 approved the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, Chennai and Sports Complex, Nadiad as KISCE in the State of Tamil Nadu and Gujarat respectively.

2. SAI conducted multiple deliberations through Video Conferencing meeting with the Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu (SDAT) and Sports Authority of Gujarat (SAG) to assess the critical gaps. During the discussions with the SDAT officials, it has been informed by the SDAT that a state-of-the art Olympic Academy at Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, Chennai is being established with main focus on a dedicated Sports Science Centre.

3. Assessments have been done for sports science equipment, manpower and sports equipment (consumables and non-consumables) both KISCEs in the State of Tamil Nadu and Gujarat. For Sports Science Equipment for KISCE Gujarat, it has been mutually decided by SAI and SAG that equipment for Anthropometry, Physiology, Psychology and Biomechanics will be provided in the 2nd Phase subject to the hiring of experts for the 04 mentioned sports science divisions.

4. The consolidated budget estimate amounts to INR 3.48 crores for the FY 2023-24 (Recurring Grant – INR 0.80 crores and Non-Recurring Grant – INR 2.68 crores) and an amount of INR 1.72 crores as annual Recurring Grant for the subsequent years for KISCE in the State of Tamil Nadu.

5. Similarly, for KISCE in the State of Gujarat, consolidated budget estimate amounts to INR 6.60 crores for the FY 2023-24 (Recurring Grant – INR 1.21 crores and Non-Recurring Grant – INR 5.39 crores) and an amount of INR 2.18 crores as annual Recurring Grant for the subsequent years.







6. Further, the Sports, Youth and Cultural Activities Department, Govt of Gujarat vide its letter no. SYCAD/102023/SAG/Khelo India/119 dated 24/02/2023 had requested to change the 3rd priority discipline under One State One Game (OSOG) policy from Archery to Wrestling. However, Sports, Youth and Cultural Activities Department, Govt of Gujarat vide its letter no. SYCAD/102023/SAG/Khelo India/500 dated 17/07/2023 has again requested to change from Wrestling to Archery under OSOG as per the discussions held via meeting dated 15/06/2023 chaired by DG (SAI). Accordingly, viability Gap Funding (VGF) for the discipline of Archery will be placed in the next PAC/DPAC after the finalization of the same.

7. Accordingly, the budget requirement for the above-mentioned KISCEs has been assessed keeping in mind the importance of developing the centre as KISCE. The detailed costing sheet for the same is placed at Annexure IV-A and IV-B.
